

# Virtual PA EBP Stakeholder Forum Agenda

January 11 from 9 am to 1 pm or January 25 from 12 pm to 4 pm

<b>Welcome and EBP Poll</b>	The forum will kick off with an anonymous poll, asking participants to rate their knowledge about criminal justice research and experience using that research to reduce recidivism.
<b>Opening Remarks</b>	Kicking off today's event, representatives of the County Chief Adult Probation and Parole Officers Association of Pennsylvania and the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency, along with a special guest from the Pennsylvania courts, will provide a statewide perspective for today's event.
<b>Opening Session</b>	John Creuzot, Dallas County Attorney and former Felony District Court Judge, will discuss how evidence-based practices are being applied nationally, at every stage of the justice system and how collaborating around these practices contribute to significant community benefit.
<b>Key Principles of EBP</b>	Forum participant beliefs about the effectiveness of specific practices will be contrasted to what researchers and field experts have discovered. Using the polling feature, participants will compare their experience and knowledge with the research evidence while learning about the key principles of EBP and what they mean for different stakeholders.
<b>Local Stakeholder Panel</b>	A local stakeholder panel will describe how EBP principles have positively impacted their local practice and where they have more work to do. Participants are invited to submit questions using the chat function.
<b>Facilitated Stakeholder Breakout Sessions</b>	Each stakeholder group will meet separately to discuss the stakeholder panel's comments, potential concerns and barriers to implementing EBP locally, and potential strategies to overcome those concerns and barriers.
<b>Debrief</b>	Each stakeholder group will report its findings and identify one thing PPCJI can do to help their EBP efforts.
<b>Call to Action</b>	PA Leaders will issue a Call to Action and review the next steps for Regional Planning Workshops.
