Bedford is a 6th class county. Criminal side we've been PAC filing for 3 years. Juvenile delinquency been PAC filing about 9 years. No issues.

Clinton County

We have been using PACfile for both Criminal and Juvenile Court since 2018. It did take some time for staff to get trained but I don't have any complaints with it. We utilize e- signatures "/S/" to save time from printing and scanning documents to PACfile. Most filed documents are just saved as a PDF unless you have attachments. I also purchased desktop scanners (Fujitsu ScanSnap) for all staff with Supervision Fee Fund to save time and make the office more efficient.
