Lancaster County – Does not. However, our re-entry coalition and CareerLink run “ID clinics” at which they help clients get ID, birth certificates, SS cards, etc. They run those several times per year.

Philadelphia County – utilizes the ID process available from PennDOT for people under supervision

Union County - We utilize the ID process available from PA DOT to get DL renewed or NonDriver ID for our folks. The process works for those in jail or on the streets. There is POC at PA DOT and an agreement to complete. PA DOT then sends you the forms to provide to clients.
