Issue: 3rd class counties - Deputy Chiefs/Deputy Directors

Question (from Lackawanna County):

Requesting other 3rd class counties the total number of deputy chiefs (or deputy directors) in your department.

(specific to: Berks, Chester, Cumberland, Dauphin, Erie, Lackawanna, Lancaster, Lehigh, Luzerne, Northampton, Westmoreland, York

Berks County

Berks has 2 deputies in each department. APO has 65 officers, JPO has 39 for a total of 105 officers when you count me.

Chester County

Chester County has 3 for 105 employees. Primary responsibilities include:

- 1: Administrative, Collections, Pretrial, Reentry
- 2: Treatment Courts, DUI Administration and Special Populations
3. General Supervision, Human Resources, Training and Policies

Cumberland County

Cumberland has 36 employees with no deputy.

Dauphin County

Dauphin is a merged probation department and has 2 deputies for each division.

Erie County

Erie County has 1 Deputy Chief with a total staff of 77.

Lancaster County

Lancaster has two deputy chiefs. One oversees our supervision services and one oversees our administrative services.

Under the supervision side, we also have two division directors which answer to the deputy director of supervision services.

I have a total of 138 staff.

Lehigh County

Lehigh has 1 Deputy Chief and 59 total employees.

Northampton County

Northampton County has one Deputy Chief. We have a total of 35 employees (PO and support staff).

Westmoreland County

Westmoreland County Adult Probation has a total of 84 employees. There is one Deputy Director.

York County

York County has 2.5 Deputy Directors devoted to the Adult Probation Office. One of my deputies' time is split between the adult and juvenile office.
