Issue: Taser Recertification

Question: (from Elk County)

I was wondering if most counties require a recert of tasers on an annual or bi-annual basis.

Allegheny County – does not use tasers

<u>Bedford County</u> - You need to complete that annually to be within the requirements that Axon has established. You will also find that your officers will perform poorly with the device if you do not train with it frequently. Many of the skills related to being competent with it are highly perishable. It is also essential that you take time to work with the device during firearms training as well. Practicing transition drills between lethal and less lethal tools should also be incorporated annually as part of your tactical shoot.

<u>Columbia County</u> – annual

<u>Dauphin County</u> – annual. Best practice recommends that all certified officers review their updates (usually less than a 10 minute PowerPoint) and then 2 trigger pull/cartridges. We have done this during our defensive tactics training and on our tactical range (weapon transition and partner drills).

Erie County – annual

<u>Forest County</u> – annual. It was bi-annual until the recommendation from TASER changed to annual
